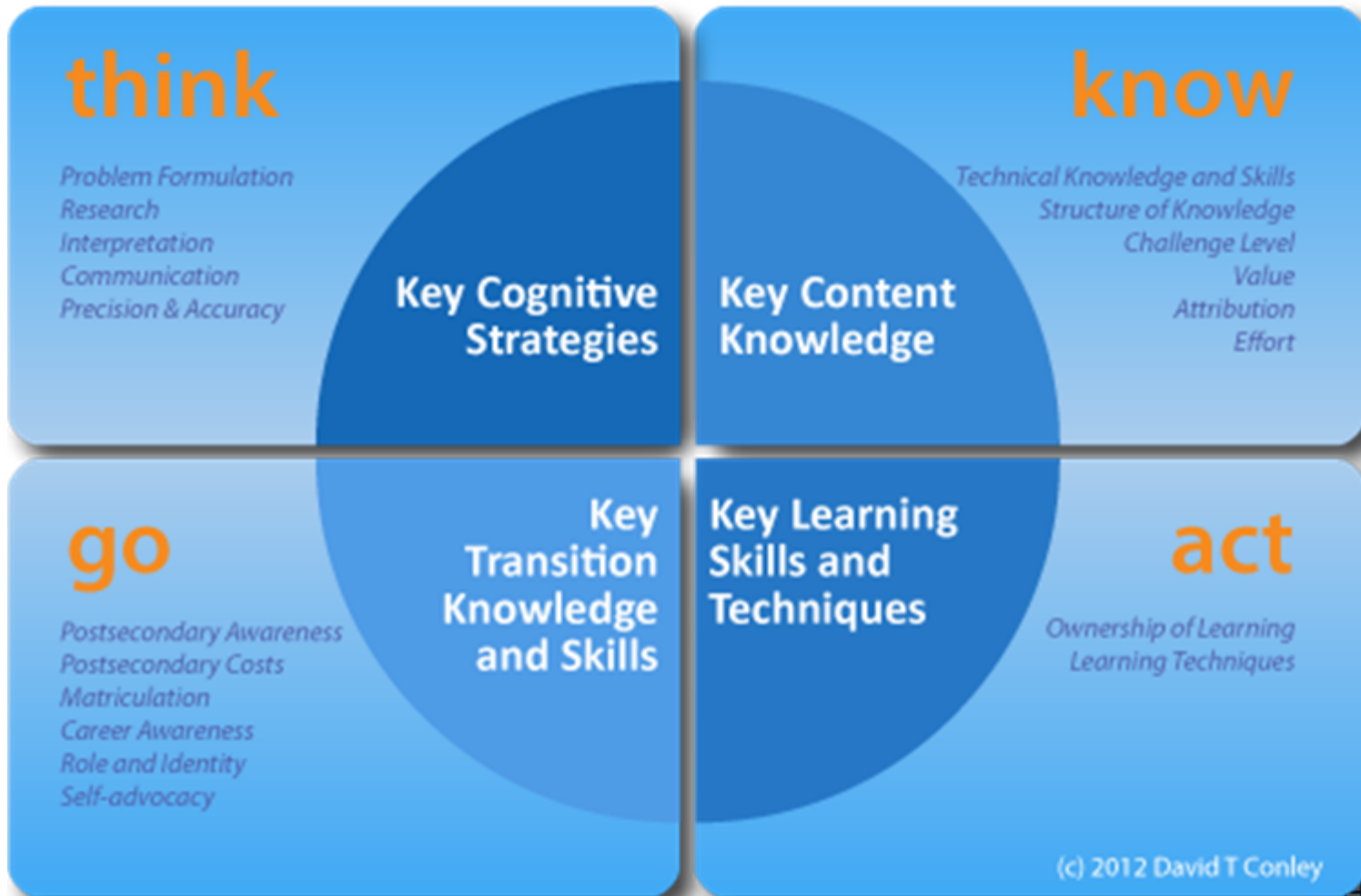
Why do this?

- Engage higher education around the Common Core State Standards and the accompanying assessments
- Create a sense of shared responsibility between K-12 and higher education for student success
- Foster cross-sector alignment efforts by clearly defining expectations for students
- Serve as a foundation or framework to establish a P-20 network that enables success

Background

- July 2012: Governor Abercrombie convenes the Board of Education and UH Board of Regents to meet with Dr. David Conley of the University of Oregon to begin discussions on a CCR definition.
- September 2012: Hawaii P-20 organizes a large summit to engage higher education institutions on the Common Core State Standards and assessments. The higher education faculty and administrators brainstorm a definition of college and career readiness.
- October 2012: CCR Definition Workgroup from UH and HODOE to draft a shared vision and define categories of readiness.
