TESTIMONY ON POLICY 103.5 SEXUAL HEALTH EDUCATION

Hawaii Youth Services Network (HYSN), a statewide coalition of youth-serving organizations, strongly supports the proposed changes to Board of Education policy #103.5 Sexual Health Education.

Hawaii's communities benefit when our youth have the knowledge, skills, and resources to make safe and healthy decisions about their sexual and reproductive health.

Because we have not yet committed the resources to ensure that our young people grow up sexually safe and healthy, Hawaii has the 9th highest rate of teen pregnancy in the United States even though fewer Hawaii youth are sexually active than the U.S. average. Unfortunately, our sexually active youth have the lowest rate of condom use in the U.S. because they lack consistent access to pregnancy prevention education at school and home. Hawaiian and Pacific Islander youth have particularly high risk of unplanned pregnancy and STIs – Their teen birth rate is 145.4 per thousand compared to 18.9 for Asians and 13.7 for Caucasians.

Young women who give birth in their teens and their children face many challenges. At age 22, only half of teen mothers have graduated from high school compared to 90% of their peers who did not give birth as teens. Eighty percent (80%) receive Temporary Assistance to Needy Families Benefits (TANF) during the 10 years following the birth of the child.

The children fare less well in school, scoring lower on standardized tests of reading and math, more likely to repeat a grade, and less likely to graduate from high school than their peers. The children of teen parents have a higher rate of emergency room visits, are more likely to have chronic health conditions, and have a higher rate of child abuse and neglect.

All of this costs Hawaii taxpayers \$37 million dollars a year, 71% of it in state and local costs. We can reduce these costs by providing culturally relevant, medically accurate, age appropriate pregnancy and STI prevention education in our schools and homes.

Hawaii residents support pregnancy prevention education in our public schools. **Ninety-seven percent (97%) of participants stated that it was important for Hawaii public schools to include sexual health education in their curriculum in a 2012 survey conducted by SMS Research.** The majority felt that neither parents nor schools were providing a sufficient amount of sexual health information, and only half felt prepared to talk about sexual health topics with their children. The majority believed that education on most sexual health topics should begin in the middle schools, with some topics (such as anatomy, puberty, and sexual abuse) beginning in the elementary schools.

Young people who complete pregnancy prevention education programs are more likely to practice abstinence, delay initiation of sex, have fewer sexual partners, and use protection when, and if, they begin having sex.

For the past 10 years, Hawaii Youth Services Network has coordinated a statewide effort to increase the number of youth that complete an evidence-based, age-appropriate, culturally relevant sexual health curriculum. We have received national recognition, including the U.S. Centers for Disease Control's Horizon Award for Excellence in Health Education, for our work in adapting evidence-based curricula to be more culturally relevant for Hawaii's students.


If the Board of Education wants to expand sexual health education in public schools, Hawaii Youth Services Network is willing to provide training for DOE personnel that includes facilitation of evidence-based curricula, parent-child communication on sexual health, anatomy, puberty, contraception, sexually transmitted infections, and other topics. As long as we continue to receive federal funding for teen pregnancy prevention, we can provide this training without any fees to the Department of Education, and even travel to conduct training on each Neighbor Island.

Everyone wants their children to grow up safe, healthy, and ready to succeed. We teach our children how to cross the street safely, because we know that one day they will face the risks of traffic. We must also teach our youth how to protect themselves from the sexual risks they will someday face.


The community supports sexual health education in our public schools, and our youth need and deserve it.

It is heartening to see that the rate of teen pregnancy across the country is declining; but Hawaii's rates of teen pregnancy are still sadly high. Teen pregnancies are a drain on families, on the hopes and dreams of our youth, and on our economy. There is a clear link between the accessibility of accurate information about sexual health and preventing pregnancy and the decline both in pregnancy rates and abortions. On the other hand, there is no basis for the claim that accurate education increases sexual activity. Re: Policy 103.5 regarding sexual health education

I am in strong support of the proposed sexual health education because I believe that in addition to academics, it is our responsibility to teach our children how to stay healthy and safe. I am distressed that loud voices distort the discussion with misinformation, and listening to them endangers our children who need accurate information to stay healthy.

Age appropriate education is just that, young children learn about "stranger danger" and "good touch-bad touch" which are important for our very youngest students. We also need to provide older students, those who are becoming sexually active, with the necessary information they need to stay healthy and make good choices for their future.

CDC statistics for Hawaii from 2013 indicate that 18% of high school students were never taught in school about AIDS or HIV infection. Yet, 36% had had sexual intercourse, 25% of those surveyed had sexual intercourse with at least one person in the 3 months before the survey, 8% with four or more persons during their life. Most alarming, 54% did **not** use a condom during last sexual intercourse, a highly risky behavior.*

In 2011, an estimated 78 adults and adolescents were diagnosed with HIV in Hawaii. Hawaii ranked 40th among the 50 states. In 2012, Hawaii ranked 19th among 50 states in chlamydial infections and 35th among 50 states in gonorrheal infections. **

I urge the members of the Board of Education to approve the proposed policy to provide public school students with sexual health education to allow students to make informed, healthy decisions and refrain from risky behaviors.

Thank you for allowing me to provide testimony.

Regarding VI Action Item J: Proposed Board Policy 101.7

I am writing to provide one principal's comments and observations regarding the proposed policy. Overall, I find the policy to be consistent and supportive of our school's approach to school climate and discipline.

The Stevenson Story:

I have served as the principal of Robert Louis Stevenson Middle School for the past four years. We serve approximately 620 students in the Makiki/Papakolea area and are a Title I school. In this time, we focused on increasing positive student behaviors and decreasing behavior incidents on campus. Specifically, there were 352 referrals in the 2013-2014 school year compared to 181 referrals this school year. The out-of-school suspensions (OSS) have also decreased from 54 last school year to 13 this school year. I attribute our success to a proactive approach to school climate and discipline.

The School Climate Goal at Stevenson is to provide all students with a safe environment conducive to learning and growing as young adults. We believe the more time spent in the classroom equals more student engagement and learning. With a safe school environment, teachers can provide all students with educational opportunities and students can work toward the goals set in our academic plan. (ex: CCSS, STEM, ELL etc.)

Our Proactive approach when working with all students:

1. Clear Expectations from the start of each school year- Grade level orientations, class visits, character building/anti-bullying lessons. We expect Stevenson students to be Respectful, Responsible and Safe contributors to the school and community. We teach the expected behaviors and constantly instill a sense of pride in our students as a part of the Stevenson Ohana- we praise them, counsel them, remind them of the good decisions we expect them to make each day.
2. Consistent implementation of the Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) program where we focus on the good things students do on a weekly basis. We recognize students through a Buccaneer of the week system and students earn rewards like lunch line fast passes and free dress. A committee of teachers oversee the implementation of this program.
3. Implementation of the At-Risk Naauao program funded by the Hawaii Community Foundation. This program was created to serve the seventy-five identified at-risk students through additional literacy support and high-risk counseling. Two identified staff members target this population of students and track their attendance, behavior and course marks using HEWS. Through this program, at-risk students are also provided with adult mentors who assist with increasing student connectedness to school.
4. Consistent visibility of administrators and counselors on campus where connections are made with students on a daily basis during unstructured time. These relationships build positive rapport between adults and students.
5. Security personnel and on/off limits areas on campus. Stevenson does not employ school-based law enforcement officers BUT we do employ trained security personnel. The purpose of security on campus is to ensure the safety and security of our staff and students. Students are allowed to congregate in specified areas on campus where supervision is provided. Security staff are trained to identify potential issues on campus, de-escalate situations, intervene as needed and remind students of expected behaviors during unstructured time. Security personnel can make referrals to administration, never directly to law enforcement.

6. Teacher training on student engagement- When students are engaged, there is less time for off-task behaviors. This past year, teachers received professional development on effective instructional strategies, tiered instruction, socratic seminars and increasing critical thinking. Frequent classroom walkthroughs and eCSSS data provided evidence of more on-task behaviors in the classroom and less disruption.

Our approach is successful in improving school climate as evidenced by the significant reductions in Chapter 19 offenses. This allows us to focus on the important work of teaching and student learning.

Observations and Recommendations re: Policy 101.7

1. *Schools shall identify school climate goals that complement the school's academic goals. A critical component of a strong and positive climate is a school-wide discipline policy that honors the civil rights of our students, sets high expectations for behavior and provides clear, developmentally appropriate, and proportional consequences for misbehavior.* Principals strive to provide all students with equal access to education and opportunities for learning by ensuring a safe learning environment. Safety is a priority on every campus. Administrators use chapter 19 as a guideline for preventing and responding to student behaviors.

2. *Schools should remove students from the classroom as a disciplinary consequence only as a last resort and only for appropriately serious infractions... The administrator with discretion and authority to effect an off-campus suspension shall in every case, prior to such suspension and in addition to other factors required to be considered by law, balance the long-term best interests of the student against overall campus safety concerns.* Principals should continue to use their judgment and discretion on a case by case basis when determining disciplinary actions. HAR 8-19, Section 7 describes the Five Factors for determining Disciplinary Actions and Chapter 19 Disciplinary Options. Administrators make reference to these documents regularly and have been trained to provide students with multiple interventions before OSS is issued. OSS is used when there are immediate safety concerns of students and staff.

3. *Such determination shall be documented in writing.* For each case, school personnel/administrators already document incidents in HIDEOE's eCSSS data system including recording interventions used and disciplinary actions. Any additional documentation as stated in the proposed policy should be added to the current system.

4. *Should schools opt to use school-based law enforcement officers, schools shall provide clear definitions of the officers' roles and responsibilities on campus and document those expectations in a written agreement designed to avoid inappropriate student referrals to the justice system, violation of civil rights laws, and information exchanges that may violate student privacy rights. The role of the officer shall be primarily focused on safety and reducing inappropriate referrals to law enforcement. Such officers shall not be involved in routine disciplinary matters. The Department shall provide training to such officers necessary and relevant to the SRO's role on campus.* The primary responsibility of the school begins and ends with the principal. SROs should be trained to provide proactive interventions in the school. The actions of the SROs, including referrals to law enforcement, should be approved by the principal.

In my opinion, the proposed Board Policy 101.7, with minor adjustments as mentioned above, reiterates and clarifies existing guidelines stated in Chapter 19.

Dear Chair Horner and Board of Education members,

Planned Parenthood of the Great Northwest and Hawaiian Islands writes in support of proposed Policy 103.5, which will promote the health and safety of our youth by ensuring that all public school students receive comprehensive sexual health education.

The current system is broken and our youth are suffering for it.

Our failure to provide students with a comprehensive, uniform sexual health education program throughout our school system has resulted in poor health outcomes for Hawaii youth, at great cost to youth, families, communities and taxpayers. Hawaii's teens currently rank the lowest in the nation for condom use and for use of any type of birth control to prevent pregnancy. Hawaii's teen pregnancy rate is 9th highest in the country, costing Hawaii taxpayers around \$32 million per year.

Hawaii currently has no uniform program and little is known about participation rates, curriculum, or implementation or enforcement of current state law or policy. Policy 103.5 would create a framework for the Department of Education to implement a uniform program that would involve parents, provide transparency, and ensure that students receive the most effective sexual health education.

Sexual health education is a positive investment in our youth with proven success.

Comprehensive sexual health education covers the wide array of topics that affect sexuality and sexual health. It is grounded in evidence-based, peer-reviewed science. Its goal is to promote health and well-being in a way that is developmentally appropriate. It includes information and communication skills building. Ideally, sex education in school is an integrated process that builds upon itself year after year, is initiated in kindergarten (with anatomy, puberty and sexual abuse, as appropriate), and is provided through grade 12.

Although parents and guardians should be the primary sex educators of their children, many parents are simply ill-equipped or uncomfortable having these conversations with their children – and so they may not happen. Compounding this problem is that children also receive messages about sexual health from many other sources - some of which may have more negative than positive impact. Schools and other community-based organizations can be important partners with parents to provide young people with accurate and developmentally appropriate sexual health education.

The goals of comprehensive sexual health education are to help young people develop a positive view of

sexual health and to provide them with developmentally appropriate knowledge and skills so that they can make healthy decisions now and in the future. Medically accurate sexual health education is an investment in Hawaii children's future and well-being. Our "return on investment" could be a generation of young people who have heard more helpful messages about sexual health than the provocative media images and/or silences they currently experience. It could be a generation of women and men comfortable in their own skin, able to make well-informed, responsible decisions, form healthy relationships, and take care of their bodies.

Sexual health education is widely supported.

Public opinion polls show that most Americans support sex education. Parents and students want sex education to be taught in our schools. In fact, Hawaii residents have shown that they support sexual health education in our public schools. Ninety-seven percent (97%) of participants in a 2012 SMS Research survey stated that it was important for Hawaii public schools to include sexual health education in their curriculum. While only half of the participants felt prepared to talk about sexual health with their youth, the majority of participants didn't feel that parents or schools were providing a sufficient amount of sexual health information. A majority also believed that education on most sexual health topics should begin in the middle schools, with some topics (such as anatomy, puberty, and sexual abuse) beginning in the elementary schools.

Hawaii's youth deserve the best and most effective health education and proposed Policy 103.5 will go far to ensure that students have the information and tools they need to make healthy, safe and responsible decisions.

The Commission supports sexual health education and opposes the condom ban. Please improve the health, safety and future of our youth by voting in favor of proposed policy 103.5.

Hawaii's youth have one of the lowest rates of condom use in the nation. Additionally, our youth experience high teen pregnancy rates and sexually transmitted infection (STI) rates. The 2013 Hawaii Youth Risk Behavior Survey, compiled in conjunction with the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the DOE, found that 36% of teens in high school were having sex, 25% of those teens had multiple partners in the three months prior to the survey, and 54% of those teens did not use a condom. Even more startling, 18% reported never learning about AIDS or HIV infection in school. Finally, 24% used drugs or alcohol before their last sexual encounter. The CDC states that the solutions to these shocking realities are better health education, more comprehensive health services, more supportive policies, and more family involvement. The Commission supports policy 103.5 and respectfully requests that you support 103.5

I have worked with youth for over 15 years. As a former health educator, I witnessed the detrimental effects of little to no comprehensive health information being provided to students. I vividly remember a male 10th grade student asking if he could avoid getting his girlfriend pregnant by taking her birth control pills. He had not been taught the most basic and fundamental biology lessons about his physiology and body. Students deserve to have medically and scientifically accurate information provided to them, so that they can make the best decisions for themselves. Withholding crucial information on basic anatomy and physiology provides a great disservice to our young students, and we have the appalling statistics to show for it. The Commission urges the Board of Education to support proposed policy 103.5. Thank you for your time.

Aloha Members of the Board of Education,

I am Dileep G. Bal, M.D., and I have been a physician active in the full-time practice of medicine and public health for over four decades in senior positions in Arizona, California, and Hawaii. I wish to emphasize that the following statements are solely my personal views. The content, however, reflects the current state of the science and state of the practice nationwide.

I understand that the Hawaii State Board of Education is reviewing Policy 103.5, which requires reproductive health education to be a part of the school system's curriculum, and Policy 103.8, which bans condoms in public schools.

I wish to unequivocally support Policy 103.5 and to strongly oppose Policy 103.8. That is my considered opinion based upon the recommendations of public health authorities nationwide.

I also understand that your Student Achievement Committee recently agreed with me on Policy 103.5 and deferred rendering judgment on Policy 103.8. I am gratified by their first action and puzzled by their second action, because the mere availability of contraceptives, especially condoms, results in a reduction in teenage pregnancy and sexually transmitted infection rates. That is a scientifically, medically, and statistically verified fact.

I am concerned, and I must confess somewhat alarmed, that we are still debating this issue in the genesis of education policy in Hawaii, in the year of our Lord 2015. When I was the Director of Health in Tucson, Arizona, in 1975, we debated this issue in a rather conservative state and came up with the only sensible solution. We collectively decided that we strongly discourage sexual activity among our school aged youth. However, in the event of our youth being sexually active (despite our collective disapproval for religious or other reasons), we would provide the

necessary help from the public health and educational sectors to prevent teenage pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections. That is our job and we did it then and still do it now.

My main concern is that teenage pregnancy and sexually transmitted infection rates are regrettably high on our islands, compared to national rates. This epidemic requires that Hawaii's health and education authorities collaborate on stemming this serious health concern for our youth. To do less, in my humble opinion, would be tantamount to medical and educational malpractice.

I have been given to understand that notwithstanding the DOE Guidelines (wishy-washy and vague as they are), some middle and high schools are neglecting to implement them, as they are not mandated. Therefore the DOE has put the burden of responsibility on the local complex superintendents and principals, thereby contributing to our current crisis. Furthermore, one major factor for this benign neglect is coercion by parents with certain religious leanings. Some educators have decided that discretion is the better part of valor, and so have been intimidated into using avoidance as a coping mechanism. I do not fault them, but wish the DOE to provide clearer direction. Moreover, many teachers in Hawaii are not even trained in the DOE-approved curricula, and therefore need clear direction and the requisite training.

As a lifelong Episcopalian and Lay Eucharist Minister at All Saints Episcopal Church in Kapaa for the last ten years, I am very sensitive to the cultural and religious nuances to this and other health issues. However, I have an abhorrence for the insertion of personal bias into governmental educational policy, especially when it is contrary to accepted medical practice and results in an epidemic of unwanted pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections among our vulnerable youth. To knowingly injure our keiki, however unintentionally, is still very wrong at a fundamental and human level. To have vested interests use some churches as bully pulpits for this effort is morally indispensable and violates the precious principal of the separation of church and state.

It is unconscionable for BOE members and others in a position of authority at the DOE to advance a policy that has universally been discredited by knowledgeable public health and

education authorities. To reiterate, in my view this constitutes medical and educational malpractice, and in fact makes you individually and collectively liable for lawsuits.

Finally, coming to the opt-in versus opt-out options, allow me to say what should be self-evident. Electing to go with the opt-in option is merely an obvious way of subverting such education from occurring. That is the only reason to choose the opt-in alternative rather than the much better opt-out alternative.

If the Board of Education assures our population that every student in Hawaii will have unfettered access to appropriate instruction and medical assistance in these areas, we should soon see a plummeting of our teenage pregnancy and sexually transmitted infection rates. Thus, we will all have an objective and quantitative measure of our collaborative success. Absent the availability of appropriate instruction and medical advice and care – i.e., the current situation – Hawaii will continue to have these outrageous teenage pregnancy and sexually transmitted infection rates.

My humble plea to the BOE is that they provide clear direction to the DOE consistent with national education and public health policy, so that every DOE complex is clear as to what they need to do, and then train the teachers to provide such education because it is now enshrined as a requirement in their curriculum.

Mesdames et messieurs may I respectfully ask you, what don't we know and when didn't we know it?

Aloha, my name is Doris Segal Matsunaga. I support sexual health education and Policy 103.5.

Our community health center has over 30 years of experience working closely and carefully with students, parents, teachers and principals to provide age-appropriate sexual health education in schools serving the Kalihi Valley community, starting with puberty education in fifth grade, and teaching evidence-based DOE-approved curricula in middle and high schools.

We have reviewed a DOE memorandum dated June 16, 2015 regarding Policy 103.5 and are concerned by some of the changes that are proposed to the Policy. In particular, the revisions add that "Instruction on sexual health education will be provided for grades ~~six~~ seven through twelve". The memo states in #4 that this change "...reflects current practice". This is not the case: We view puberty education as age-appropriate sexual health education. And 6th graders at some middle schools participate in DOE-approved evidence-based curricula that were developed specifically for that age group. We urge the BOE and the DOE not to limit age-appropriate sexual education to beginning in seventh grade. Middle schools include sixth graders and there is ample evidence that this is an effective age to begin education regarding positive relationships, making healthy choices, and basics about the human reproductive system.

Dear Hawaii State Board of Education:

I support sexual health education and Policy 103.5, and I ask that you do too.

My name is Carmille Lim, and I'm a graduate of Pearl City High School. I transferred to PCHS in my junior year, when it was known for its alarming teen pregnancy rates. At PCHS, I was in Advanced Placement classes, active in the student body, a cheerleader, and a member of SongFest, the school newspaper, and yearbook staff, and DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America). I share this to help you understand the perspective I bring from interacting with various groups of students.

We'd be remiss if we continue to ignore the need to provide students with comprehensive, medically accurate, age-appropriate sexual health education.

As a teenager, I was constantly bombarded with glorified images of sex and sexual relations. Now, with the prevalence of social media, the barrage of sexual content and pressure teenagers face has increased.

I remember my peers and I being too embarrassed to ask adults for advice on sexual relations and sexual health. Instead, we defaulted to asking each other and older peers for advice. We also often speculated what could or couldn't happen, or what is or isn't normal.

Three episodes in particular stick out for me. I believe these illustrate severe misunderstandings teenagers may have about sexual health:

1. Junior year: one of my peers had gotten pregnant because she and her boyfriend believed that if he "pulled out" in time, she couldn't get pregnant.
2. Senior year: one of my sophomore peers had gotten pregnant because she had unprotected sex, but "followed the moon cycle", based on her friend's advice.

Typically, teen pregnancy is associated with certain "types" of students from particular high school "crowds." Many people think that only the cheerleaders, jocks, "popular" kids, and "slacker" kids get pregnant. I've heard this used to justify why sexual health education is not widely needed. However:

3. Senior year: a junior student had gotten pregnant; she and her boyfriend were proud, self-proclaimed "band-geeks" and "math nerds", and were in AP classes. She shared that they wanted to try unprotected sex. They thought she wouldn't get pregnant if they had gone without protection *just once*.

During my time at PCHS, I knew many young women who have misinterpreted domestic violence for love, and have gotten pregnant while in these violent relationships. Including information on "healthy relationships" and sexual violence is a key component of the proposed policy 103.5 that could encourage young women to evaluate a romantic relationship they may enter.

I strongly believe that these incidences could have been prevented if sexual health education was accessible on campus. The brief stories I've shared with you happened to peers I had within different "circles." Misunderstanding sexual health is not limited to a specific "type" of student, and distribution of sexual health education is broadly needed.

This is our chance to make significant steps toward preventing and reducing teen pregnancy and teen domestic violence.

Please improve the health and safety of our youth by voting in support of the proposed policy 103.5.

Hale 'Opio Kaua'i, Inc. has worked within the school system on Kaua'i with special education and disconnected youth since 1975 and is a current community partner with the Hawaii Community Foundation and DOE Hawaii P-20 collaborative to prevent drop-outs by improving attendance, grades, and behavior in "off track" middle school students.

The majority of students with the highest absenteeism in FY15 was due to suspension from school for non-violent activities.

Using this school discipline data, corroborating research, and US Department of Education and National Association of School Superintendents policy directives, our school's academic plan for FY16 includes only in-school suspension so that all youth receive their free, appropriate public education and any positive behavior supports and skills required for their benefit.

Further, all teachers have been trained in positive behavior supports by Jean Nakasato and in TRIBES to further engage the school community in a climate of respect and inclusion. We have no school resource officers on campus, which in other schools on Kaua'i drove up the arrest rates of juveniles disproportionately, and brought civil rights matters to the attention of the Prosecutor.

I firmly believe Policy No. 101.7 provides a quality framework for achieving our educational goals for all young people to become capable and competent citizens and urge you to lend your support

Additionally, all programs should include a focus on consent and healthy relationships.

I'm a teacher in a DOE high school, and I personally see and hear the need for true and thorough education about sexual health. I've had many pregnant students in my nine years of teaching here, and most of those young women were unprepared for the realities of being a parent at such a young age. Every year my students tell me how little they know about birth control and STIs. I've witnessed their surprise and curiosity when we have specially parent-approved guest speakers from Planned Parenthood and Malama Pono discuss concepts such as ovulation and viral versus bacterial infections. These are basics of being a healthy person that these students really deserve to be taught.

And please consider that this curriculum should not merely be thrown into a few weeks of ninth grade health. Providing consistent and continuous sexual health education ought to be a huge priority at each grade level.

Hale 'Opio Kaua'i, Inc. provided the social work and psychological services for the Kapaa High and Middle School Health Center, a partnership with GN Wilcox Health Services, Wilcox Clinic, and Kaua'i Community College, in the 90s. Hale 'Opio's Street Smart implementation was evaluated for five years by UH Manoa in 2007 as effective in reducing risk of HIV, pregnancy, and substance use, and we currently are working to reduce teen pregnancy and its social and financial implications, through federal grants for the past eight years. We are active with the Department of Health's Kauai Health and Wellness Initiative, in support of DOH goal to reduce teen pregnancy on Kaua'i.

Originally from NC, I went to grade school in New Jersey where sexual health education began in the fourth grade. I recall discussing what the teacher taught us with my peers to clarify some of the information we had about anatomy, puberty, and sex, and with my mom after the first day of class, which provided a springboard for values clarification and goal-setting within a framework of normal human development. I felt I was well educated, that the schools were giving us the best and most information they could; I valued my teachers and 96% of my class attended college.

My experience since 1975 working with Hawaii adolescents is quite different. In 1976 youth were having sex, getting STIs and having babies others raised, beginning the burgeoning foster care system characteristic of Hawaii until early 2000s. These young parents didn't know their body parts, their biological functions, normal human development, and were not self-sufficient citizens, generally speaking. "No one" used birth control, since that meant they were actually thinking about the dirty act of sex, which they experienced "while sleeping". Still, nearly half of young people engaging in sex in Hawaii's high schools are having unprotected sex and there are pregnancies in middle schools. Grandparents are now the primary parents due to shifts in federal human services law, and while pregnancy rates are declining since the 90s, Hawaii pays 32 million annually for not providing sexual health education, resulting high rates of teen pregnancy.

The Hawaii Department of Education, a federally funded system in a democracy, has the obligation to empower young people with knowledge to make healthy choices based on credible information so that they, within a personal context of values, set and attain goals built on competencies developed through a comprehensive education. It is not the Department's prerogative to align with religious or other groups who are editing science to control curricula. It is further not the prerogative of the Department to bar access to scientific and health curricula, but is mandated to provide a free, appropriate education. Parents may opt-out of this federal mandate.

I urge you to adopt Policy No. 103.5. Let's work to minimize the harm teen pregnancy inflicts on our youth while compromising our state economic and social future. Let's assure our science and health education curricula are comprehensive, including sexual health.
