EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) was signed by President Obama on December 10, 2015, and represents good news for our nation's schools. This bipartisan measure reauthorizes the 50-year-old Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), the nation's national education law and longstanding commitment to equal opportunity for all students.

The new law builds on key areas of progress in recent years, made possible by the efforts of educators, communities, parents, and students across the country.

For example, today, high school graduation rates are at all-time highs. Dropout rates are at historic lows. And more students are going to college than ever before. These achievements provide a firm foundation for further work to expand educational

ESSA Team Purpose

Purpose:

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Team was formed by Governor Ige to establish "Hawaii's Blueprint for Education" - a coordinated, strategic and transparent design that will serve as the framework for the Hawaii Department of Education's plan to the U.S. Department of Education.



ESSA Team Vision

Vision:

Seizing upon the opportunity afforded by the passage of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act, Hawaii has the unprecedented opportunity to create the best public education system in the nation. We will accomplish this through reinvigorating a culture of innovation that empowers schools to deliver education to our future generations in a manner that encourages decentralized leadership and reflects our enduring sense of community, culture and values.



ESSA Team Mission

Mission:

In concert with the Hawaii Board of Education and the Hawaii Department of Education, the mission of the Governor's ESSA Team is to LISTEN to input from public education stakeholders, IDENTIFY areas of need in Hawaii's public education system, and RECOMMEND a way ahead for the Governor.



GOVERNOR IGE'S VISION STATEMENT

“Future focused empowered school communities that inspire leadership, creativity, and innovation in a healthy and safe learning environment.”

Examples of Review Findings by ESSA Team

- *Achievement gap: 55% gap in reading, 48% gap in math*
- *Least restrictive environment gap (HI vs nation): 25%*
- *Graduation gap for ELL: only 53% of ELL students graduate*
- *Early Learning: only 3,675 of 35,000 children served, at current rate will take 150 years to enroll 75%*
- *Learning environments and facilities: 280 million backlog – at current rate will take 150 years to catch up*
- *Teacher shortage: 1650 teacher vacancies; teacher satisfaction decreased from 88% to 65%*
- *Student voice: student satisfaction decreased fr 85% to 69%*
- *Parent engagement*
- *Education Week gives Hawaii a grade of D+ for student achievement in 2016*

Example of engaging stakeholders

- › *Attendees in favor of empowerment and innovation – learner outcomes “stronger” and “more explicit”*
- › *Attendees said that Governor’s Vision Statement is “inspiring”, “great”, “concise”, “proactive”, and “promotes innovation and creativity”*
- › *Key questions: What is meant by trust based system?, SEA vs LEA?, Where is personalized learning? Can we evaluate teacher education programs at colleges?*
- › *School Principals: want more flexibility to hire, need support from OHR, don’t tie principals hands, central office needs people with experience in schools*
- › *Teachers: want academic freedom, need time, need more and better PD, need resources, want to be treated as professionals, want a say in funding*
- › *Parents: need transparency, more community discussions, local tests, local curriculum*
- › *Community: want quality involvement, sharing/communication needs to be reciprocal, system - value the role of stakeholders, systemwide outcomes*

Examples of engaging stakeholders

- *New indicator for School Accountability according to ESSA?*
 - *Teacher engagement – 17%*
 - *School Climate – 17%*
 - *School Culture – 17%*
- *Should there be two accountability systems, one for ESSA and one for Hawaii?*
 - *Yes – 32%*
 - *No – 24%*
 - *Not sure – 43%*
- *Should Hawaii apply for ESSA Innovative Assessment Pilot?*
 - *Yes – 50%*
 - *No – 41%*
 - *No opinion – 9%*
