# SUBJECT: Update on the Review and Extension of the 2011-2018 Joint Department of Education and Board of Education Strategic Plan

# 1. DESCRIPTION

On January 19, 2016, the Board of Education approved a review and extension of the strategic plan to guide the next few years. In the spirit and practice of an approach of continuous improvement, the review and extension retains the 2012 update's goals and framework for improvement as a strong continuing foundation for educational improvement but will make mid-course adjustments to better support improved student outcomes.

This September 20, 2016 presentation is a continuation of the Department's monthly progress reports on the strategic plan review and extension process.


# 2. PRESENTATION



Student success is supported by important and appropriate division of 3. roles and responsibilities among schools, complexes and state offices that: - provides flexibility in schools' planning and implementation based on schools' and communities' needs, strengths, assets, desires, and opportunities; fosters innovation; - benefits our schools by taking advantage of economies of scale and shared risks; and - honors state procurement, ethics requirements, employees' collective bargaining agreements, and other obligations by ensuring compliance with laws, regulations, and policies.
