- SUBJECT: Approval of Kealakehe Intermediate School's School Community Council (SCC) Waiver regarding school schedules.

I. <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>

That the Board of Education (BOE) approves Kealakehe Intermediate School's SCC Waiver Request allowing the school to implement a schedule that does not meet the statutory requirement of implementing a school year of 180 days in order to provide one day of professional development for their teachers.

4. <u>DISCUSSION</u>

a. Conditions leading to the recommendation

Board of Education policy 2413: Upon application to the Board of Education (Board) a school may be granted waivers from student instructional hours and school year requirements pursuant to HRS 302A-251. The Department of Education shall administer such procedures as may be adopted by the board.

b. Previous action of the Board on the same or similar matter

The Board has approved similar requests for waivers that do not meet the statutory requirement of implementing a school year of 180 days in order to provide professional development for their teachers.

Hawaii Revised Statutes 302A-251 (Act 167) - Student Learning Time

d. Arguments in support of the recommendation

Kealakehe Intermediate has requested to implement a schedule that does not meet the statutory requirement of a school year of 180 days in order to allow teachers to attend the Association of Middle Level Educators Conferences on Oahu which is to be held on Friday, February 2, 2018 on Oahu. Although the waiver request was submitted late the justification for this is due to the late notice to the school regarding the conference date.

Based on the school's academic plan and the state's strategic plan this conference will continue to support student learning by developing a broader sense of how middle level students learn and develop The conference also will deepen the teacher's senses of responsibility which is part of the HA initiative.


