

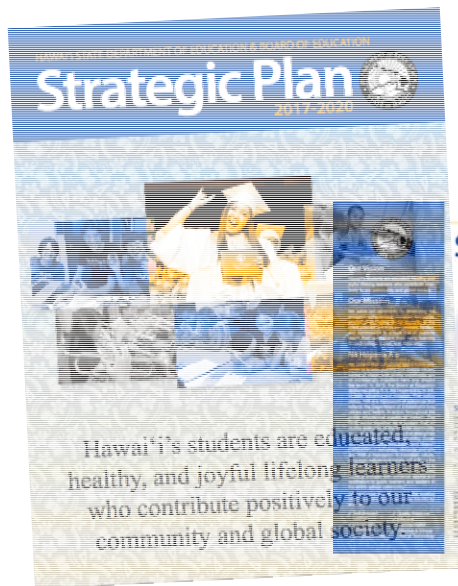

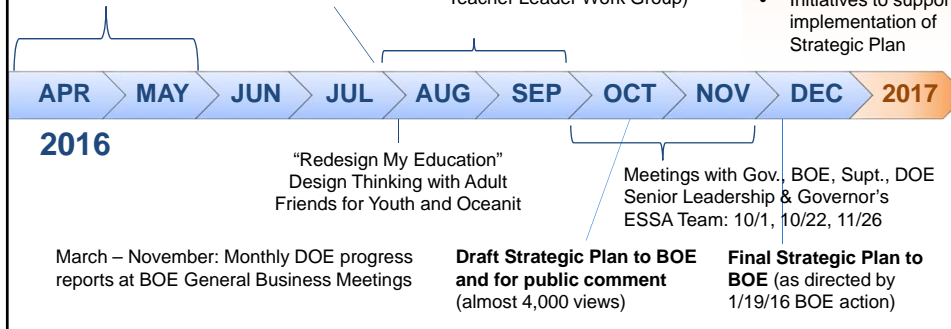

2017-2020 Strategic Plan

Shifts since 2012 update

- **Student-centered:** Objectives for Goals 2 & 3 support Goal 1
- **“Equity and Excellence”:** Commitment to more targeted strategies and reporting of indicators focused on closing the achievement gap
- **Differentiated actions and supports:** Balance of statewide direction with flexibility for school and community strengths, opportunities, aspirations and student needs

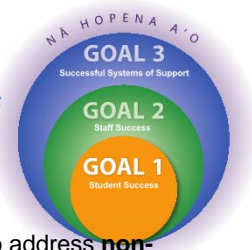


- **More focused set of progress indicators**
- **Focus on empowering students with emphasis on career aspirations**
- **Grounded in Hawaiian values**
- **Inclusive of charter schools**
- **Explicit about innovation**
- **Extensive stakeholder engagement**



2017-2020 Strategic Plan

Sample of 'game changers' identified by stakeholders



- Plan acknowledges what educators and community members have always believed was good practice and good for students:
 - **Well-rounded education**
 - **Whole child focus**
- **Bright Spots** values our local educators' expertise and success
- Explicit focus on **transitions**
- Stakeholders of all role groups see a place for themselves in (and can make contribution to) the plan
- Partnerships to address **non-educational needs of students** (e.g., mental, physical and behavioral health) and **student attendance** would provide resources which have been needed and lacking
- **Innovative options to earn high school diploma** could make a big difference for students graduating
