Superintendent's evaluation

On May 19, 2017, the Board of Education ("Board") announced that it selected Dr. Christina Kishimoto as Superintendent beginning August 1, 2017. The Board now must clearly set its expectations for Superintendent Kishimoto that it will use to determine her performance.

To do this, I recommend the Board establish an investigative committee, pursuant to its by-laws<sup>1</sup> and state law<sup>2</sup>, to work with Superintendent Kishimoto in setting her goals and targets and to determine the evaluation tool that the Board should use to assess whether or not she has met those goals and targets.

Proposed Motion: Moved that 1) an investigative committee (a permitted interaction group pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes §92-2.5(b)(1)) be established and tasked with setting the Superintendent's goals and targets and

The Board members designated by the Board are required to report their resulting findings and recommendations to the entire Board at a properly noticed meeting."

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Section 92-2.5(b)(1), Hawaii Revised Statutes, states, "Two or more members of a board, but less than the number of members which would constitute a quorum for the board, may be assigned to . . . [i]nvestigate a matter relating to the official business of their board; provided that:

<sup>(</sup>A) The scope of the investigation and the scope of each member's authority are defined at a meeting of the board;

<sup>(</sup>B) All resulting findings and recommendations are presented to the board at a meeting of the board; and

<sup>(</sup>C) Deliberation and decision making on the matter investigated, if any, occurs only at a duly noticed meeting of the board held subsequent to the meeting at which the findings and recommendations of the investigation were presented to the board[.]"
