Kula Kaiapuni is available in very limited areas across the state. Many families who desire Kula Kaiapuni must travel outside their community. Until such time that Kula Kaiapuni expands through equitable resourcing and support, we foresee transportation as a continual burden to many Kula Kaiapuni students and families.
