

Perkins Legislation & the BOE

June 5, 2012

My goals today are to

1. Provide background on the Perkins grant as it pertains to the BOE.
1. Inform the BOE of the statute requiring their participation in the CTE Advisory Council;
2. Instruct the members of their basic duties and responsibilities on the Council;
3. Ask for one of the appointed members to step forward and chair the July 25th meeting where election of next year's officers will take place.

Some background:

OVAE sends funds to Hawaii for both Adult Education and for Career and Technical Education.

The Hawaii Legislature determined that the Adult Ed funds would be administered by the DOE, and the CTE funds would be administered by UH.

Funding for CTE comes from the federal Perkins Act of 2006

The purpose of the Perkins Act is:

“To more fully develop the academic, career, and technical skills of secondary and postsecondary students who elect to enroll in CTE programs.”

Hawaii's Perkins allocation:

2011: \$5,519,365

2012: \$5,523,624

Eligible agencies: DOE, UHCCs, & DPS

Perkins Governance in Hawaii:

Directed by:

Act 71, SLH 1968, Act 192, SLH 1974, the
Hawaii Revised Statutes – 1990 Supplement
(Section 305A-4), and Act 58 (Section 305A-
4)

Under the statute...

The UH Board of Regents is designated as the **State Board** for CTE and represents the State in all Perkins-related matters.

The **State Director** manages the grant and reports to the Board 4 times/yr.

Also required under the statute is...

The CTE Coordinating Advisory Council,
the CTECAC

The CTECAC consists of 11 members

3 are appointed from the Board of Regents of the University of Hawai'i by the chairperson of that body.

3 are appointed from the Board of Education by the chairperson of that body.

3 are appointed from the Workforce Development Council by the chairperson of that body.

2 ex-officio members are the UH President and the Superintendent of Education.

The CTECAC

Advises the State Board on all matters pertaining to CTE, primarily:

1. The State Plan
2. Allocation of funds

Recommends to the State Board

1. Annual report to the USDOE on the performance measures
2. Annual report of activities and expenditures to the Governor's office.

The Council meets quarterly and at such other times as required.

Officers

The members elect a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson, whose terms do not exceed one year.

The Vice-Chairperson is the Chairperson-Elect succeeding the Chairperson after election of a new Vice-Chairperson.

Elections are held during the summer meeting of the Council.

The State Director, who is not be a member of the Council, serves as the Executive Officer whose responsibility includes follow through on actions taken by the Council.

- The current CTECAC Chair is from the Workforce Development Council and his term is up for both the CTECAC *and* the WDC.
- My request today is that the BOE designate one of its CTECAC members to chair the July 25th meeting where elections will be held.

Finally...

May we brag a bit?

In 2010-11

27,401 secondary students earned at least one credit in a CTE course.

2,421 12th graders completed the requirements for at least one CTE Program of Study.

The graduation rate for students who completed a CTE program of study was **98.14 %**.
