Nature of Cyberbullying

- ◎ Instant - Type and “Hit”
 - > Infiltrate social network
 - > Impacts – harassment, humiliation, withdrawal, skip school, etc..suicide

- ◎ Hawaii Research
 - > 50%+ of teenagers cyberbullied via internet or texting on cell phone

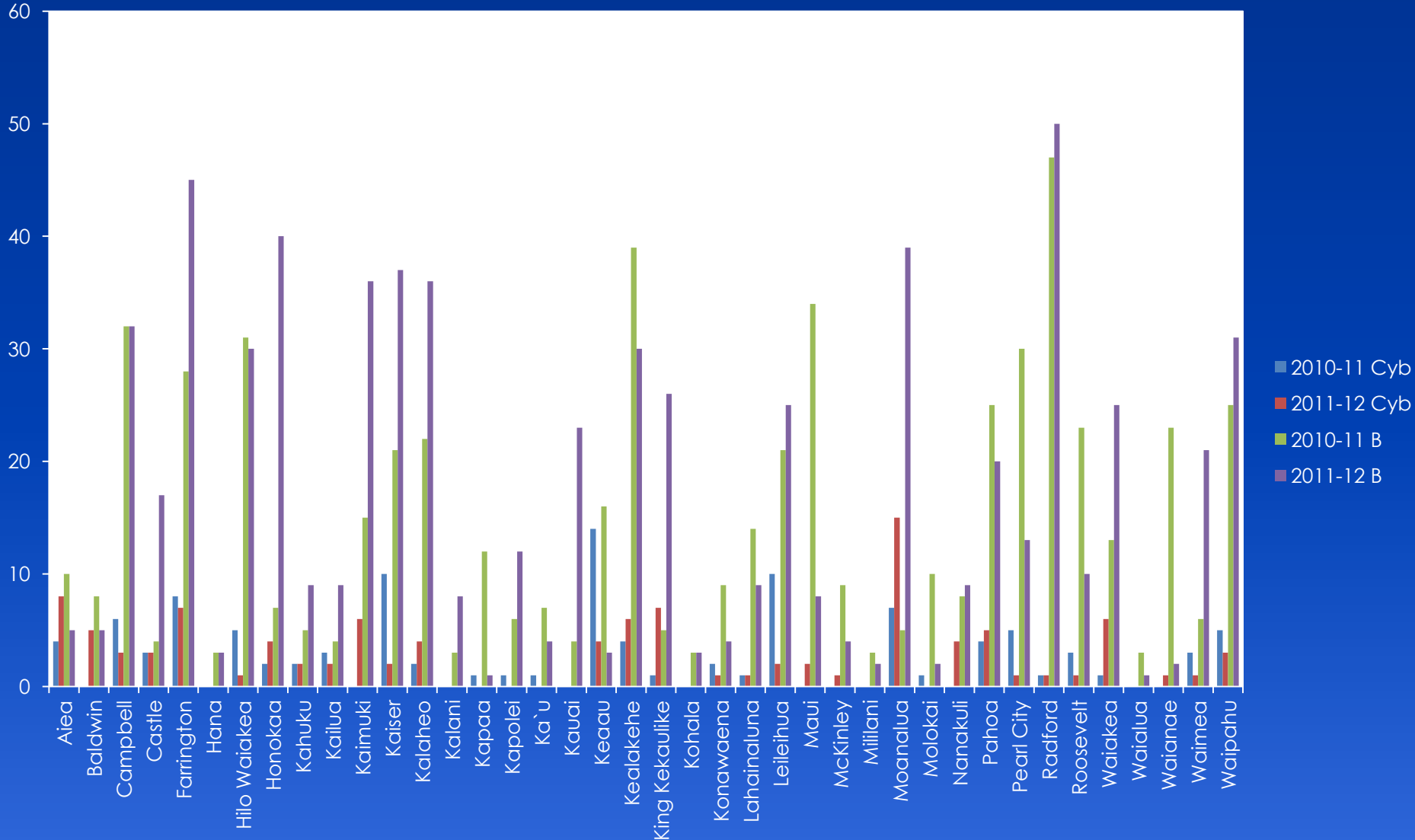
Defined by HAR Chapter 19

1. On campus, other DOE education premises, on DOE transportation, during DOE sponsored activity on or off school property
2. Through DOE data system without authorized communication, or
3. Through off campus computer network that sufficiently severe, persistent, that creates intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment



⦿ Majority cyber incidents occur off campus during non-school hours

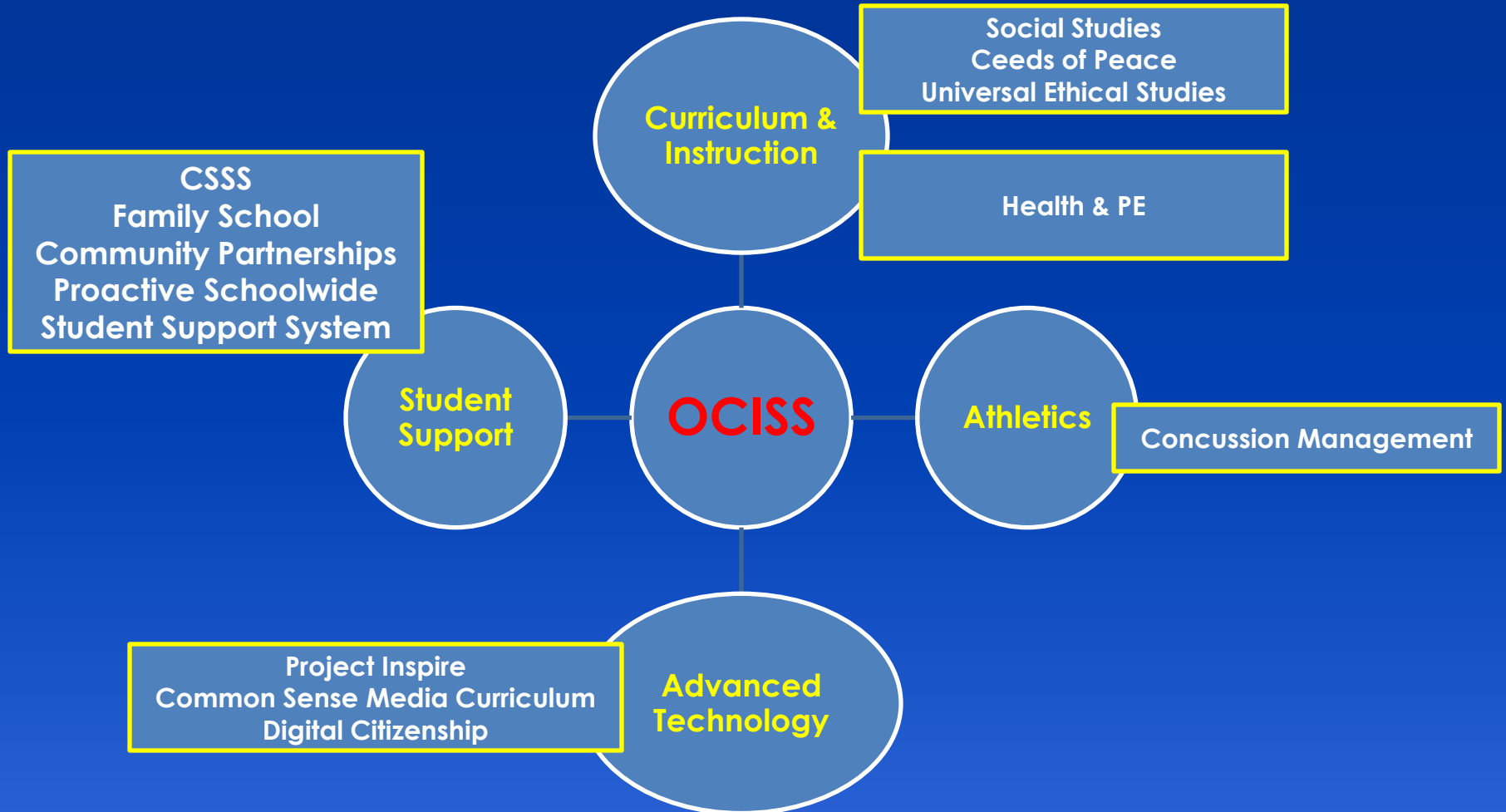
