Aloha BOE Members,

I am writing to respectfully request more information about the Department's Fiscal Update. Specifically, I would like to know how the Department plans to allocate remaining ESSER funding to support the goal of effective academic practices through extended learning opportunities.

Fiscal Services reports a balance of \$2,239,277 in ESSER III funding for rigorous afterschool programs with a expiration date of September 30, 2024.

Of the total ESSER II funding expiring at the end of September 2023, the Department reports a balance of \$1.8 million. Please explain the Department's plan to use this remaining funding before the expiration date.

When I look at the list of schools with afterschool programs funded by the ARP and ESSER I notice that out of the 18 schools listed, not one Kauai school is represented.

One of our highest need schools, Kapaa Middle School, is in the process of establishing a much needed afterschool program. Uplink funding was pursued but not approved for this program.

As a community member and advocate for youth mental health, I stress the importance of funding this program at Kapaa Middle School so that it can be started this year. I implore the Department to look for ways to support the beginning of this program by meeting their modest funding needs.

A. Presentation on Department of Education ("Department") Fiscal Update: operating budget and carryover funds for Fiscal Year 2023-24, supplemental operating budget for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, and Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund ("ESSER") resources

**<u>Comments Only:</u>** Thank you for this update.

- a. Much of this relies on the Supplemental Budget proposal. FIC must meet on October 5., unless Supplemental Budget can be presented earlier (end of September-Special Meeting). Keeping in mind the average deadline to submit is October 9!!
- b. Position and FTE/Character of Expenditure link doesn't work
- c. EDN 200 (Instructional Support) and EDN 300 (State Administrative Programs) seem to be in jeopardy.
  - 5% Contingency restriction on "Discretionary General Fund Appropriations. Awaiting release of funds later in fiscal funds, once B&F has better outlook.
- d. Again, the Legislature has been unable to provide consistent fiscal support for schools (as previously promised), continuing the uncertainty.
- e. Calling Attention to page 4. "Context to \$163.5 M unfunded general funds for FY2023-2024. (Thank you, Brian)
- f. Bottom of Page 5, Brian has included a note on Carryover funds. Please read it before asking questions that are provided here.

There is a link to watch for these carryover funds in a detailed format, by school, etc.

g. ESSER Funds: Expectations are that these fundfs are fully expended by lapse date. Do you anticipate that occurring?

- e. Will you Lower the requirement for students to have a parking pass?

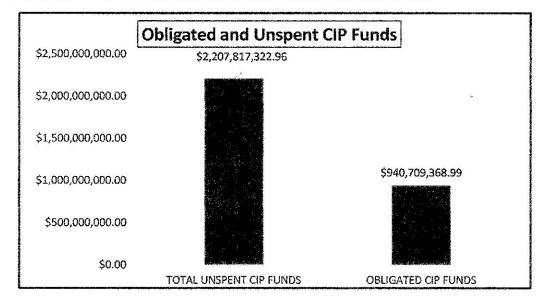
### The Board and Public deserve:

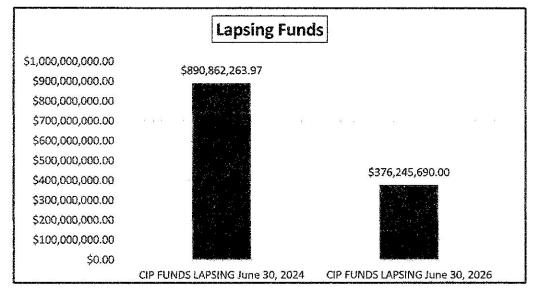
- 1. A list of high schools or other schools that were affected to include island and district

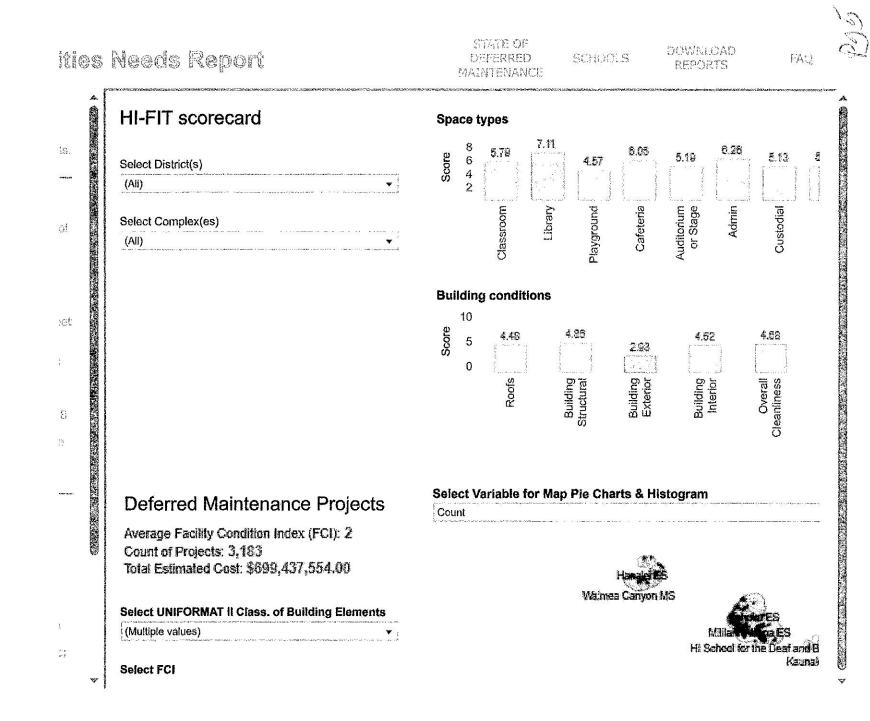
