






# The percent of completers taking Advanced Placement (AP) exams and the percent scoring $\geq 3$ are steadily increasing.



















Five-year trend of completers who enroll at UH











#### Summary

- Participation in dual credit increased by 9 percentage points (2011 to 2016)
- AP exam-taking increased by 13 percentage points (2011 to 2016)
- CTE Concentrators increased by 8 percentage points (2014 to 2016)
- College-level English increased by 15 percentage points (2011 to 2016)
- College-level math increased by 13 percentage points (2011 to 2016)
- College enrollment has plateaued around 55%
- College persistence remains steady around 78%





### College aspirations vs. first fall college enrollment


Three years of completers (Class of 2014, 2015 & 2016) with 11th grade ACT results










# Economically disadvantaged students are less likely to enroll right away.








### English Language Learners are less likely to enroll right away.



# Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander students are the least likely to enroll right away.








# College Enrollment Rate Disaggregated by Gender, Race/Ethnicity, Economic Status


Class of 2016 college enrollment rate
