SUBJECT: Review of Strive HI: 2022-23 State and School Performance Reports

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) issues the Strive HI School Performance Reports each fall on the performance of individual public schools and of public education across the state. Strive HI reports for School Year (SY) 2022-23 are being publicly released today. Reports are available online at http://bit.ly/StriveHISystem.

2. DESCRIPTION

Strive HI reports on annual performance measures are required by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act and Statewide Student Success Indicators in the Department and Board of Education's (Board) Strategic Plan, 2017-2020. Schools may also provide information about their school, including additional school-selected performance measures, in their school report.

The statewide Strive HI report for SY 2022-2023 is attached. The report includes performance of all public schools, including public charter schools. Prior to the public release of these reports, all Department schools and public charter schools, complex areas, and state leadership teams received embargoed information for planning and support purposes.

School performance in SY 2022-23 is important in understanding the impacts of pandemic-disrupted education on students. On key measures, last school year's performance improved over the SY 2021-22 school year but have not returned to prepandemic levels:

- Student attendance improved with fewer students being chronically absent (15 days or more of absences): 30% in SY 2022-23, down from 37% in SY 2021-22. However, as with national trends, student absences continue to be high. Since the pandemic, elementary students have had the highest levels of chronic absenteeism.
- In SY 2022-23, student achievement, as measured by statewide assessments in language arts, mathematics and science, continued to improve slightly though have not yet reached pre-pandemic levels.
 - Language arts performance held steady with 52% of students demonstrating proficiency on the state standards. Language arts proficiency is measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessment (English medium), KĀ'EO Assessment (Hawaiian) and HSA-Alt (alternative assessment for students with significant cognitive disabilities) which are administered in grades 3-8 and 11.
 - Mathematics performance improved with 40% of students demonstrating proficiency on the state standards. This is an improvement of 2 percentage points from SY 2021-22. Mathematics proficiency is measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessment (English medium), KĀ'EO Assessment (Hawaiian) and HSA-Alt (alternative assessment for students with significant cognitive disabilities) which are administered in grades 3-8 and 11.
 - Science performance remained at 40% of students demonstrating proficiency on the state's Next Generation Science Standards. Science assessments are administered in grades 5 and 8 and in high school for Biology students.
 - Assessments continue to reflect differences in achievement levels among student groups, with students who have high needs demonstrating lower levels of proficiency than those who do not have high needs, and fewer Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander students demonstrating proficiency.
- While Hawaii's student performance has not yet reached pre-pandemic levels, Hawaii's students are doing relatively well compared to students in other states in returning from the pandemic:
 - On the National Assessment of Educational Progress assessments from 2017 to 2022, changes in Hawaii's 4th and 8th grade student results were more positive than the national average. Hawaii's fourth graders had the highest reading gains and among the lowest math declines in the nation.
 - Hawaii's students are demonstrating high levels of proficiency among states administering the Smarter Balanced Assessments in Language Arts and Mathematics. Since last school year, many states experienced no change or slight declines in student proficiency levels on the Smarter Balanced Assessment.

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The Strive HI reports also provide information about other indicators of student progress including reading proficiency levels, on-time promotion from 9th to 10th grade, on-time graduation rates and college enrollment rates of high school graduates.

Next year's Strive HI report will reflect statewide and school performance for Department schools for SY 2023-24 and be revised to incorporate Key Performance Indicators in the Board of Education-approved Strategic Plan Implementation Plan.



Strive HI Performance Report



Student Attendance


Chronic absenteeism (15 or more days out of school)

Academic Achievement – Language Arts


Strive HI: Percent of students proficient (statewide)

Academic Achievement – Math


Strive HI: Percent of students proficient (statewide)

Academic Achievement – Science





NAEP Performance SY 2017-22


Grade 4 Reading and Math Results






NAEP Performance SY 2017-22

Grade 8 Reading and Math Results






Percent of students proficient or above, 2022-23

English Language Arts




