

# 2024 Excellence in Safety Award - Government Category



James Boretti, ASSP President, Kyle Morikawa, Royal Elementary Vice Principal, Jennifer McNelly, ASSP CEO, Mark Behrens, safety and security specialist, HIDOE received the award on Oct. 30.

Royal Elementary School received the 2024 ASSP Excellence in Safety Award in the government category by the American Society of Safety Professionals.

The school was recognized for its dedicated focus on emergency preparedness, student involvement and community relations.

Only two other schools in Hawai'i have previously won this recognition.

The criteria used for the project is a locally created metric that accounts for Hawai'i's unique sense of place including microclimates, tradewinds and energy efficiency.




# **Construction Management Association of America**


